


Dishes needs a clean? Support the school

Tarras Fire Update


This month has seen the continuation of what may turn out to be a record year for us, now up to 39 callouts.


Many thanks to both companies for their assistance.

Once again many thanks to both Placemakers and Santana Minerals.




Community Newsletter - August 2024
