"The Community looking after the Community"

With the year coming to a close the small Tarras CRG has been working away in the background to identify how such a group can benefit the community should an emergency occur. We are currently waiting to identify the right location for an emergency response centre and expect that will be confirmed in February next year.

Maybe this holiday break is the right time for each household to **establish or check** their emergency kits and plans.

Tips for getting ready:

- Check out <u>www.getready.govt.nz</u>
- Make a Household Plan consider tenants and the visitors you may have over the holidays. Will they know what to do in an emergency situation? Don't forget your animals!
- Put together emergency supplies make sure you have supplies to last at least 3 days.
 Water 3 litres per person per day; medication.
- Have a grab bag ready or at least know where your important documents/items are
- Make your home safer secure heavy items; know how to turn off gas and water to your property; Think about external rainwater storage.
- Sign up to Otago Gets Ready for emergency alerts. https://commbase.nz/join/otago.
 This was very effective in the recent flooding in East Otago.


