This was as a result of generous donations, the community stall (local baking, produce, plants) and the very popular raffle..We sold 123 tickets with the winners being



Ever wondered about the face, behind the apron, behind the counter? Well wonder no more – meet Wanda Grant, the smiling face in the Tarras Village Store.


