





If you follow our Facebook page you will be aware that students have recently been able to use the swimming pool again for swim training and water confidence lessons. This has been made possible by the hard work and long hours put into the project by Liz Carroll-Lowe. Liz worked hard to secure funding for the pool re-fibre glassing and project managed from start to finish. The last part of this stage was the installation There are a couple more ideas floating around in Liz's head to complete the pool area, so although the project is not complete in her mind, we could not be any more thankful to her for getting the Tarras School swimming pool user friendly again.

The re-fiberglassing work was carried out by contractors from The Composite Group based in Christchurch. This business was extremely responsive to our needs and provided support at all stages of the project. Scaffolding and shrink wrap was supplied at a heavily discounted rate by Southern Lakes Scaffolding, these guys jumped in at the last minute to save the project from having to stop before it got started. The chemicals had to be stored in a specific way and R and R Hiab in Cromwell provided a container for this purpose at no cost, Nichols of Cromwell have provided two gorgeous benches for spectators to use - the wonderful people donated one and sold us the other at cost price. The engraved plaques for these benches come from John Swan in Dunedin.

Funding was secured from the following places: Otago Community Trust, Cromwell Community Board (CODC), Christchurch Airport Community Fund, Otago Community Trust, Friends of Tarras School, Tarras School and a small amount of anonymous personal donations. Tarras School would like to thank all of the above for their support in this project.

The Tarras community once again rallied together and should feel incredibly proud.
 Providing accommodation, Team Tarras who provided meals for the contractors, answering frantic phone calls to come and move items with a tractor to right at the end with a group of parents cleaning up the area ready for use. Without the community support the project would not have been as successful as it was. The contractors all felt spoiled during their time here and Tarras School is happy that they left our small village with such positive feelings.

As the next stages of the project continue it is hoped that the community continue to support this project as hopefully for summer 2023/24 there will be a working solar system and shade for all to enjoy poolside.
