

Alice is coming to Tarras School from Rimu Full Primary School. She is excited to join the community and get to know everyone. Alice is big on all things fun, engaging and purposeful in the classroom that connect to the outdoors and help to further develop life long skills.

Alice will be joining the school at the beginning of Term 4 2023 and the school will have a lot of exciting times to look forward to.

The start of Term 3 has been busy with our topic this term being "Making our Mark". This has a sustainability focus and students will be exploring how they can leave a positive impact upon the area they live in. If you have any sustainability related practices you would be keen to share with the students they would love to hear from you.

Students attended a theatre show at Te Kura o Takakarara last week and enjoyed exploring the school playground over there. Next week students will travel to Poolburn to compete in the small schools cross country. A big thank you to all our community members who support these events by providing transport to the venues.

The school tunnel house is up! Paul has worked extremely hard to ensure the tunnel house has been built to last a long time, the ground works took some time but it is looking ready to now progress the next stages of installing potting benches, water tanks and developing the seed to plant process.
