

## **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT**

## Reporting by Tarras Chick

At the Tarras tennis courts, (old and new), you will find two seats that call out for you to sit, relax & watch the world go by. Each bears a plaque that reads "Jill and Bill Jolly 1916-1978". There is no doubting that the Jolly name is synonymous with Tarras, & has been for many generations. But who were Jill and Bill & why do they have memorial seats?



The Jolly farm (Kotiti) was drawn in the 1910 sub-division of Morven Hills by Bill's father, EA Jolly. Bill was the youngest of nine children & as none of his siblings were interested in taking over the family farm, Bill continued to farm it. Some of Bill's 6 sisters ran the Tarras post office at various times.

When World War 2 broke out, Bill was devastated to fail his medical to sign up due to flat feet, however it was ironic that he was able to go on to play rugby for Otago, the South Island team & play in the final All Black trial in 1939, that team was never announced due to the outbreak of the war.

Jill's father drew The Point in the same 1910 sub-division, & she lived there until her marriage to Bill. Unlike Bill, Jill did not go to the Tarras Primary school as there was no 'top bridge' across the river, so she & her siblings went to Cromwell instead, where they were weekly boarders. Jill attended Otago university, when war broke out she signed up with the Women's Land Army which was formed to manage the acute farm labour shortage due to male farm workers signing up to go to war. Jill's parents, Jack & Ida Lethbridge, became avid travellers & in 1929 on one of their adventures, they stood on the Great Wall of China. In later years Jill & Bill also enjoyed travelling & in 1965 spent 7 months in Europe.

Both Jill and Bill were very involved in the community & great supporters of the many club & organisations in Tarras at the time, particularly the Golf, Rugby, Tennis, Pony & Dog Trial clubs. In 1978 Bill & Jill retired to Wanaka where they built one of the first houses in Rippon Lea, sadly Bill died only a few years later & Jill continued to live there until moving to a retirement village in Mosgiel. When Jill moved from Wanaka she asked Tarras Rural Women to sell the contents of her house & for this money to be used in Tarras for community projects. Bill & Jill were survived by their 3 children, Pete is still farming Kotiti, while both Linda & Jacqueline now live in Auckland.


