

Students have had an exciting term learning about stories of settlement in Tarras. It has created lots of reflection on how different people before us lived, but also made students think about how they want Tarras to develop as they get older. A stand out was the desire for Tarras to have a Dr's! 3 days spent at Alexandra outdoor Ice rink supported students to improve their ice skating, curling and ice hockey skills. Huge thanks to Rebecca and Bruce who guide the students through their paces in the most wonderful ways. In the last week of term students have attended the "Water skills for Life" programme at Cromwell Pool. This provides students with basic knowledge around water safety and gives the opportunity to experience deep water in a safe environment. After swimming, students visited Sue at Cromwell Library to explore what is on offer to them at their local library. The kapa haka group attended the Upper Clutha Kapa Haka Festival on 19th June. All students participated in workshops to learn a new waiata, a haka written by students last year relevant to the Upper Clutha area and played traditional Māori games. They completed the day with a performance. Huge thanks to Ali Macdonald who played the guitar for our group on this occasion – it really added to our waiata.
