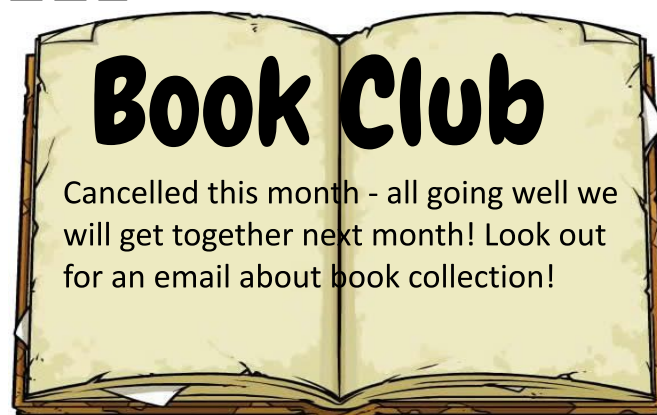

TARRAS SCHOOL



Kia ora

Autumn is upon us and the mornings are getting chillier but our learning is heating up as the term progresses. This term year 4 - 6 are completing a mini project about the sun. The project began with shadows and student curiosity has so far taken them on to explore time zones and soon seasons. The way the world works is super interesting and can be a difficult concept to grasp - students are so lucky to have small numbers so students' wonderings get discussed. Year 1 & 2 are exploring the world of fairy tales - a giant is taking shape on the classroom wall and there have been gingerbread men baking (not escaping!). Sadly Covid red level put a dampener on the majority of our exciting EOTC events happening in Term 1 and so have been purely school based for the year so far.

In 2022 Year 1 & 2 are in a learning space with Mel on Mon - Thurs, Year 4 - 6 in a learning space with Chrissy or Rachelle Mon - Thurs with all students learning together on Friday's with Rachelle or Chrissy. Tarras School students are exceptionally lucky with the teacher to student ratio and it is evident through the quality of learning happening that the students are benefitting hugely from this set up. It is the hope that this is able to be continued for a long time, eventually with the MOE realising the need for more teachers in small rural schools.

The school swimming pool will close for the season on Thursday 14th April. There is the hope that before the pool is opened for the 2022/23 season there will have been some refurbishments completed. If you know of anyone who is keen to donate to see this project achieved please get them in touch with someone at school. Keys will need to be returned to the office and then deposit refunds will be processed by Letitia. It has been fantastic to see pool use on the rise over this summer, 15 keys were sold which is our highest ever.

The staff at Tarras School are on multiple learning journeys themselves during 2022. Along with the Wanaka cluster staff are working with Rob Profitt-White on a maths journey, working with Keryn Hooker to explore creating a local curriculum and will be participating in Incredible Years training. Alongside this Tarras School Board are still working alongside ERO to ensure systems are current and working effectively for the school, this includes curriculum reviews and strategic planning.

Funding from the sale of the land to the council for the toilets will be spent this term on upgrading one side of the smaller classroom to double glazing. This will make a huge impact upon retaining heat in the winter, and also enable better air flow during the summer months with opening windows being installed. The 10 year plan is currently being drafted which will see some more maintenance work carried out on the building to keep it up to scratch.
