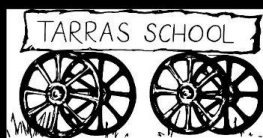

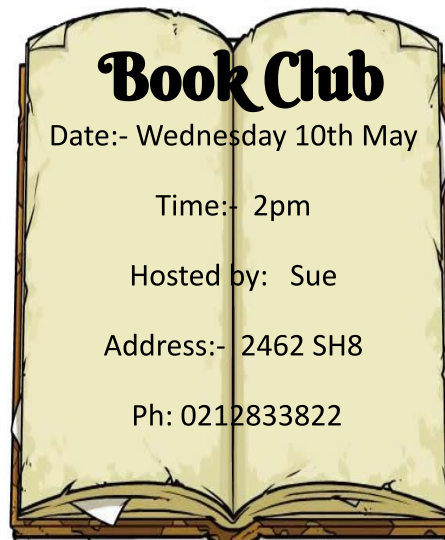

The students came back from the Easter break refreshed and ready to learn. We had a couple come back with casts on their arms but broken arms don't stop the students from participating in all learning experiences.

Students are learning this term about "Stories of Settlement". They are asking questions about Tarras and how people came to live in the area. They hope that some locals will come in and share their settlement stories with them. The students have been amazed that the roads all used to be gravel and how houses have changed.

The year 5 and 6 students went to Wanaka Primary School and worked as a team to take part in the Epro8 challenge, a STEM challenge with a focus on engineering. It is reported they worked well as a team and played on each of their strengths.
