Following is from Bill Gibson, 93 yrs old of Wanaka

Tarras was named by J.T. Thomson when he came through this area in 1857. Thomson was _ the first Chief Surveyor for Otago and was responsible for many of our present day place names eg. The rivers (Lindis), creeks (Cluden, Timburn and Tarras) and mountains (Dunstan and Pisa). The creek that he names Tarras in those times started on the South side of Lindis Peaks, flowered down through Malvern Downs then on in front of the present Tarras Store, meandering down through Maryland and Tomic, through Davidson's then into the Lindis River. The creek reminded Thomson of Tarras Waters after a moorland near Langholm in Dumfriesshire, Scotland. I have visited Tarras Waters and while there is no village centre as such the country is very similar to what we have here.
