

Kia ora

After over 60 editions this will be the last time I write the school round up for Tarras Talk - thank you to all those community members who read this each month. I would like to thank everyone who has supported Tarras School whilst I have been in the principal role. It has been a great privilege to hold this position and I will take learnings and memories from my 6 years here forward into my life. I will ensure I follow the Facebook Page and read the Tarras Talk each month to ensure I am up to date on what everyone is doing at school.

At school in the past month students have managed to not get blown away by the wind, have watched the daffodil bulbs bloom again and dodged rain showers - Spring is definitely here at Tarras School.

Students finished their ski season with all of them exploring more of the slope than previously. attempted to catch most of them on my camera but sometimes my skills don't keep up with them especially over jumps! Our ski experience at Cardrona was great, less crowds and we even got mostly sunny days. Thanks to all the instructors up the mountain who show a lot of patience with all our

skiers.

Year 3 - 6 visited the team at Santana Minerals where they got to see the rocks that have been drilled out of the ground. Students were shown how the geologists log their finds and what is important to look for - seeing gold flakes was pretty cool. The students were taken up to see the Monopoly themed street names where drilling explorations have already occurred. Visiting the Come in Time Battery, which has been beautifully restored, was a great lunch spot. Most of the students came away excited to have the potential to work at a gold mine so close to home one day!

Emma, from St John, came into work with the students on what to do in an emergency. They learnt about simple first aid and how to call for an ambulance. There was practise in putting on bandages, using the recovery position and DRSABCS. Be assured that if you are in an accident with a Tarras

School child they will know what to do.

Lucy, from Enviroschools, visited again and brought with her the Enviroscape. This model lets you add buildings, animals and other additions similar to the area we live in. She then took the students through what happens when it rains and storms, students could see the difference that is made by planting some native trees and bushes along water ways and in other areas.
