

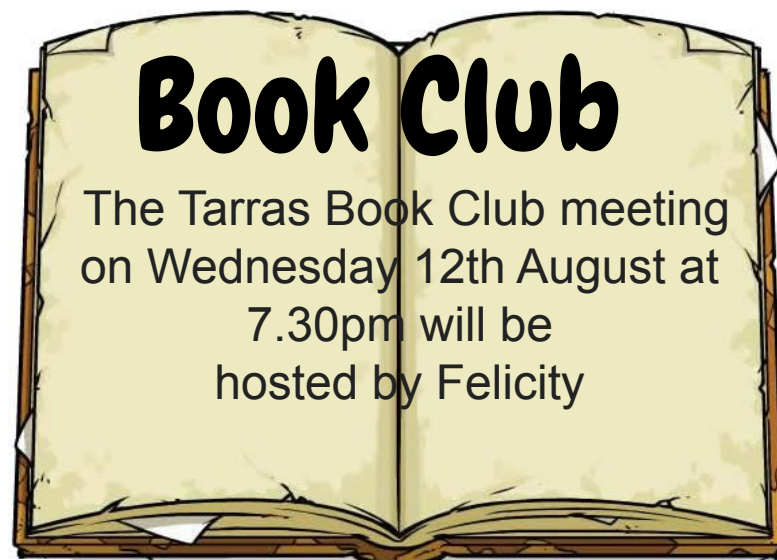

## Lara Hall and Rachael Griffiths-Hughes Concert

To be held at the Tarras Church, Friday 4th September 2020.

Waikato University-based duo Lara Hall and Rachael Griffiths-Hughes present a programme of Georgian violin music, full of elegance, drama and the spontaneous flair that their performances are known for. At the heart of the programme are a set of 18th-century English sonatas by Joseph Gibbs. These have recently come to be considered of musical importance but are as yet relatively unknown to listeners. The sonatas, which encompass a great variety of styles, take the listener on a journey with many entirely unexpected twists and turns.
