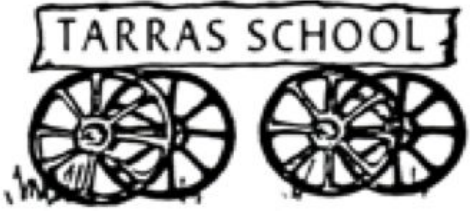
After a great harvest and vintage we will be open with winter hours from Saturday 1st June.
