Helicopter/fishing accidents, injured trampers & holiday makers aplenty. Margo lived some distance from ambulance station, so local policeman used to collect her & take her directly to scene, while the ambulance met them there. Only a small group of volunteers, so call outs were frequent.

Margo & Skip moved to Hawea where Margo (& that Bar Managers licence) got a job at Hawea Hotel. Margo loved bar work as the chat with locals was genuine & enjoyable. Next she worked for Bullock Bar (stayed 10yrs), who owned Luggate Hotel & 1 other. Margo was Administration Officer for all 3 establishments. Bullock Bar had licence to run the bar at the Wanaka A&P show. Margo really enjoyed her time associated with this.

Margo & Skip moved to Tarras & built their home. Daughter, Brenna had horses & the land & serenity of Tarras was important. Brenna is now a school teacher at Te Kura o Take Kārara. Margo is Upper Clutha Rugby Club Secretary. She was involved in many years of planning & fundraising to replace old club rooms - new facility completed 2018. Margo says new club rooms have been built with love with many original items retained, including the oregon beams locally sourced & milled.

Margo enjoys golf & informally heads “social committee”, using her fundraising skills– oh that Bar Managers Licence! Margo is Secretary at Tarras Collie Club Dog Trials after being told its was a simple “one day job”. Yeah right.

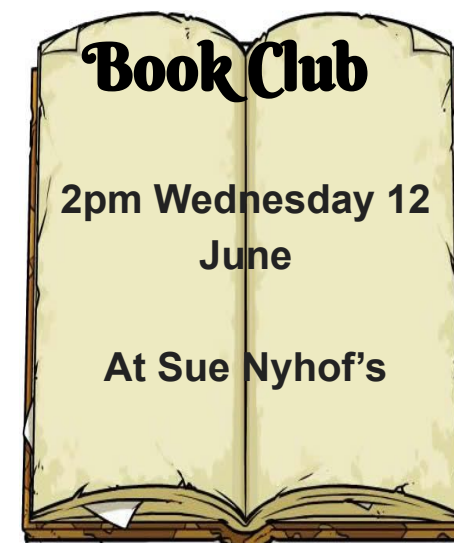
