The Lindis Group offers volunteer conservation work in a stunning environment in one of the loveliest sub-alpine tussock landscapes in New Zealand.

The work we do involves the control of weeds, sweet brier and lupin in the Lindis Pass Scenic Reserve which compete with native species and diminish the outstanding character of the tussock grassland. With consent from the Department of Conservation, we also manage a snow tussock restoration project, and we pick up an astonishing amount of rubbish from our roadside clean up.

DAFFODIL DAY

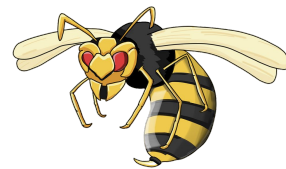
Thanks to the generosity of the Tarras Community and the passing public who supported us on Daffodil Day, \$1037.30 was raised for the Cancer Society.

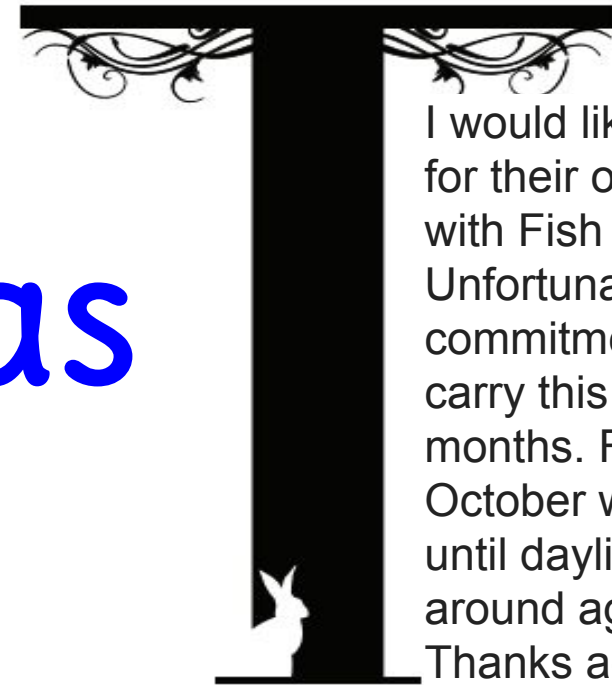

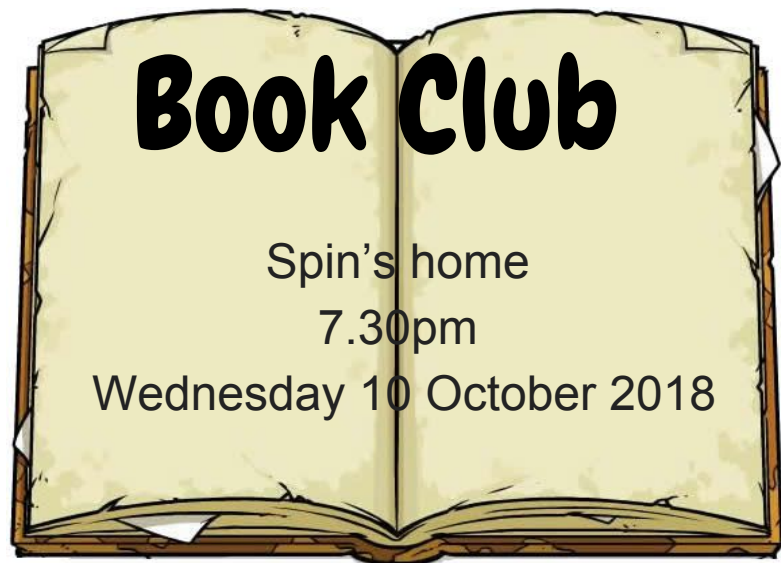

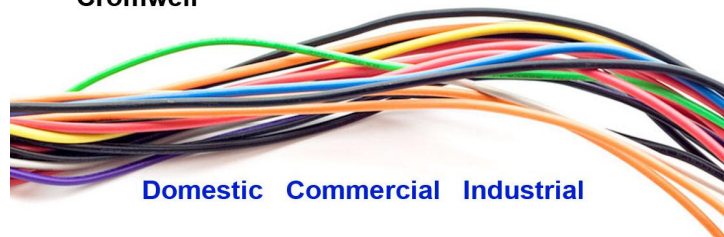

On Saturday 27th October the students will host a seedling sale at school. They have planted up courgette, beetroot, bean, corn and lettuce. There will also be some strawberry runners available. This will help raise funds for our Garden to Table project. The students have chosen to use any money raised to repaint the vegetable raised beds. We were very kindly donated Tui Seedling Mix by Mitre 10, lettuce seeds from Kings Seeds and Fertilpots and seed soak by BioGrow. **Come and buy your seedlings between 10am and 2pm.**

Students are starting to think about items that will sell well on our produce stall. If you have been by lately you will have seen "Bird Bites" for sale for all your hungry garden birds. We are still selling pine cones for your spring fire needs! The students have decided to raise some funds towards the purchase of some new playground equipment, with the focus at the moment on a new swing set.

We are hoping to open the school pool for use in Term 4. To do this we have had to run some repairs on the pool system. FOTS have funded a new filter which was installed in early September. We are hoping to install a shade sail to provide some respite from the hot Central Otago sunshine. Pool keys will cost \$60 this year to take into account the amount of work that goes into keeping a pool running - \$25 as a returnable deposit and the remainder going towards pool maintenance. We thank those members of the community who purchase a key to use over the summer months - we know that the pool is well used and a great asset in the heat. The padlock has been changed for this year so if you have an old key please return this to school. Keys will be available to purchase after Labour Weekend.

Exciting news for Tarras School - we have been allocated some additional funding to redesign our toilet area, we are only at the design stages of this process and will keep everyone well updated with any information. We are hoping that all work is completed before the start of the 2019 school year.

We will welcome Bodhi to school in late October. Bodhi will be the 4th Watson child to go to Tarras School and we are looking forward to having all his energy here 5 days a week.

If you have a 4 year old at home please pop in and chat about starting some pre school visits. These visits happen on a Thursday morning and really help a future Tarras School child to learn about school, meet their peers and provides a period of time to adjust to school so when they arrive at 5 they already know the expectations and routines.
