Please buy and use the orange bags. They are available at the Tarras Store. This user pays system suits us at this present time. Abuse of the system reflects badly on us all.

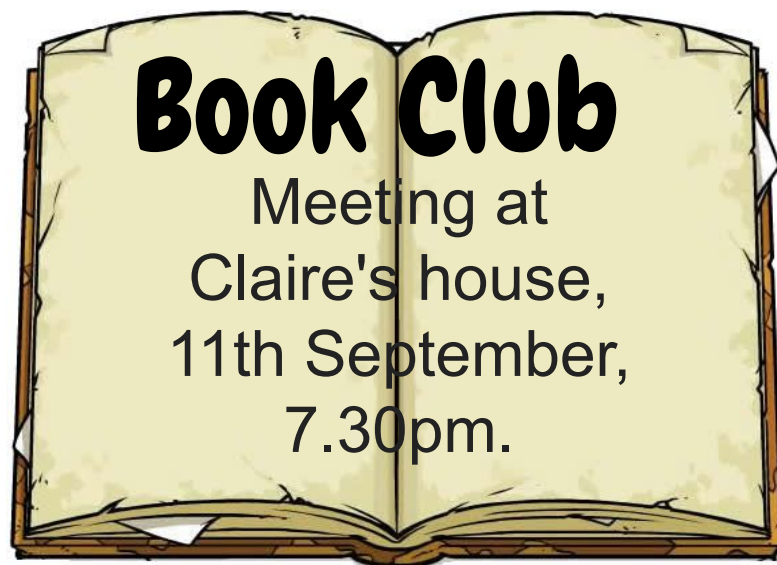
