




Community drop-in sessions

Scott has had many exciting adventures oversea & has become adept at documenting his adventures using multimedia formats. His latest efforts saw him announced as Winner of the Best Self-Filmed Film Solo Award: "Solo" in the NZ Mountain Film & Book Festival 2024.

Loving adventure sports himself Scott created the ultimate race - The Revenant: 200km & 16,000m-ish of vertical ascent. Unsupported individual run. Map & compass only. No watches allowed. 60 hrs to complete the challenge, using only traditional methods to tell when 60 hrs is up. Miners navigated their way across this unforgiving wilderness in search of gold. A few got rich. Most didn't. The Revenant is run across the same unforgiving terrain, with a similar chance of success. The Revenant Ultra Adventure Run is known as one of the most gruelling adventure races on the planet. Only a handful of people have ever completed the race since its inception 5 yrs ago. Previous competitors have included US Navy seals, & competitors have come from Scotland, England, Germany, the United States, Australia & of course New Zealand.

Scott's next adventure earlier this year, led him, with a mate, on another epic journey down the Yukon River. They became known as *"THE DAFFODIL PADDLERS"*. Starting at Marsh Lake (Canada), they paddled 2000 miles (3200 km) down the Yukon River to the Bering Sea, finishing at Emmonak (Alaska). This journey was fraught with natural challenges, including encounters with bears. They were entirely self-sufficient, with no outside contact except for emergencies. 

TARRAS SCHOOL


Kia ora,

Update:

So far, we are a team of **23.** "Thank you" to the wonderful volunteers who are interested in helping the Tarras Community in an emergency.

There is much going on behind the scenes so that we have the right information, the right training, the right support to ensure we remain engaged and get prepared for whatever comes our way.

We have been meeting with other CRGs around the area to see what they have done, what they decided not to do (no need to recreate the wheel) and what still needs doing. We have divided Tarras, the wider geographical area, into sub-groups to make localised support more efficient. We have been looking into venues for a base, equipment needed, roles needed, personnel needed, funding needed.

The recent flooding in East Otago highlighted the benefit of good community planning.

We will be highlighting the 4 R's in building Community Resilience to Cope with Emergencies.
